Prayer comes from a humble heart

St Cyprian's treatise on the Lord's Prayer

Let our speech and our petition be kept under discipline when we pray, and let us preserve quietness and modesty – for, remember, we are standing in God's sight. We must please God's eyes both with the movements of our body and with the way we use our voices. For just as a shameless man will be noisy with his cries, so it is fitting for the modest to pray in a moderate way. Furthermore, the Lord has taught us to pray in secret, in hidden and remote places, in our own bed-chambers – and this is most suitable for faith, since it shows us that God is everywhere and hears and sees everything, and in the fulness of his majesty is present even in hidden and secret places, as it is written *I am a God close at hand and not a God far off. If a man hides himself in secret places, will I not see him? Do I not fill the whole of heaven and earth?*, and, again, *The eyes of God are everywhere, they see good and evil alike.*

When we meet together with the brethren in one place, and celebrate divine sacrifices with God's priest, we should remember our modesty and discipline, not to broadcast our prayers at the tops of our voices, nor to throw before God, with undisciplined long-windedness, a petition that would be better made with more modesty: for after all God does not listen to the voice but to the heart, and he

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who sees our thoughts should not be pestered by our voices, as the Lord proves when he says: *Why do you think evil in your hearts?* – or again, *All the churches shall know that it is I who test your motives and your thoughts.*

In the first book of the Kings, Hannah, who is a type of the Church, observes that she prays to God not with loud petitions but silently and modestly within the very recesses of her heart. She spoke with hidden prayer but with manifest faith. She spoke not with her voice but with her heart, because she knew that that is how God hears, and she received what she sought because she asked for it with belief. The divine Scripture asserts this when it says: *She spoke in her heart, and her lips moved, and her voice was not audible; and God listened to her.* And we read in the Psalms: *Speak in your hearts and in your beds, and be pierced.* Again, the Holy Spirit teaches the same things through Jeremiah, saying: *But it is in the heart that you should be worshipped, O Lord.*

Beloved brethren, let the worshipper not forget how the publican prayed with the Pharisee in the temple – not with his eyes boldly raised up to heaven, nor with hands held up in pride; but beating his breast and confessing the sins within, he implored the help of the divine mercy. While the Pharisee was pleased with himself, it was the publican who deserved to be sanctified, since he placed his hope of salvation not in his confidence of innocence – since no-one is innocent – but he prayed, humbly confessing his sins, and he who pardons the humble heard his prayer.

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COMENTÁRIO No seu caminho para Jerusalém, Jesus entra numa aldeia, como antes tinha recomendado que os seus enviados fizessem, e é recebido por uma mulher, o que no tempo era algo muito estranho. Lucas, ao apresentar este episódio, deve ter em mente o facto de os evangelizadores da Igreja primitiva por vezes serem acolhidos por mulheres (cf. Act 16,14-15). Mas ainda mais estranho é o comportamento de Jesus a anunciar a «Palavra» a uma mulher, algo proibido pela Lei. Maria, em atitude de discípula, está sentada aos pés do Senhor e escuta. Jesus não faz discriminações. Ele vê em cada ser humano, homem ou mulher, uma pessoa à qual Deus dirige o seu amor e as suas exigências.

Parece que as mulheres distribuíram as tarefas: Marta assume o papel de dona de casa que prepara a refeição e Maria assume o dever de fazer companhia ao hóspede. Mas, no nosso texto, aquilo que parece normal assume o sentido de lição.

Jesus não condena Marta pelo trabalho («serviços», «servir») que ela está a fazer, até o elogia, mas o facto de estar atarefada, preocupada e agitada com muitas coisas. Não se trata dum banquete, não são precisas «muitas coisas». E sobretudo, com os muitos afazeres, Marta está a perder uma oportunidade única que Maria está a aproveitar. A única coisa necessária nesse momento é a

escuta da Palavra. Esta é a melhor parte, o fundamento de toda a vida, de todo o serviço aos outros.

Não se trata de opor o serviço à escuta da Palavra, mas sim de prioridade, porque uma coisa sem a outra não faz qualquer sentido para aquele que quer seguir Jesus. É o que nos Actos dos Apóstolos vai ser bem vincado: «Não nos convém abandonar a Palavra de Deus para servir às mesas» Quanto a nós, permaneceremos assíduos à oração e ao ministério da Palavra» (Act 6,2.4).

From a homily by Archbishop Cordileone

Our call to holiness, then, must be lived out *in our bodies*. Paganism was characterized by dualism, a separation between body and spirit: the body, as pertaining to the realm of the material, was seen as evil, or at least as inconsequential. All that mattered was the spirit, a consideration independent of the body. The Christian way of viewing the world is not dualistic, but sacramental: the physical world is the means through which God reveals the hidden, spiritual world of His Kingdom, the world for which He created us. This sacramental understanding of the created order engenders a profound sense of the sacred: in our worship, in our relationships, toward our bodies, and most especially with regard to marriage as the primary, privileged institution by which God reveals the mystery of His life in us. This is that higher wisdom of which St. Paul speaks: “the wisdom of this world is foolishness in the eyes of God.”

It is a curious irony that, in this post-modern age, the old pagan idea is popular once again: what one does with one’s body has nothing to do with what it means to live in Christ. This is for sure that ancient pagan dualism, and the consequences are all around us, perhaps affecting even believers in subtle ways: a loss of the sense of the sacred, often even within the temple in the sense of the church building, characterized by a loss of the respect and reverence owed to the house of God. Even more so, it is characterized by a disregard for human life in a whole variety of ways, and disregard even of marriage. What is meant to be a lesson in self-oblation, of giving oneself to another, has become inverted and is now seen as a relationship that is all about me: what *I* get out of it, what makes *me* happy, and so a relationship worth staying in as long as *I* derive some benefit from it.

Sadly, this way of thinking leaves innumerable victims in its wake: not only children deprived of growing up with both parents, but also those spouses who are committed to working out their marital difficulties but to whom the law gives no special claim over their husband or wife who cares only about their own immediate benefit. This is the culture we live in, it’s all around us and in the air we breathe and so, again, affects even people of good will. That is why sometimes even when both spouses want to work through their difficulties; they do not find the

support and wherewithal to do so. The now popular idea of marriage as an arrangement for the satisfaction of the adults who enter into it and who define it as they will is the ultimate profanation of the sacred, the banalization of the most precious, sublime gift that God has given us for the common good and for the good of our salvation.

Such thinking is that wisdom of this world which is “foolishness in the eyes of God.” It is completely earth-bound, a way of living in which one is closed in on oneself and closed off from the transcendent dimension of our being created in God’s image. This is the mentality that sees the pursuit of a religious vocation – be it one of the various forms of Consecrated Life, or the vocation of Priesthood – as “a waste.” It sees only the material, and cannot see the spiritual dimension. It therefore fails to

understand the sacramental meaning of the body in such a vocation. Notice that, while there are many male religious orders of consecrated life, there is no rite of consecration to a life of virginity lived in the world for a man. This is not because men are not called to the same purity; rather, it is because only a woman’s body can convey what it means to be a bride, and thus serve as an icon of the Church, the Bride of Christ. In the same way, only a man’s

body can convey what it means to be a bridegroom, and so only a man can be an icon of Christ, the Bridegroom, in the sacramental order of the Priesthood.

Those who lack a sacramental understanding of the world see these states of life not as vocations, but as jobs, no different from a number of any other jobs in the Church. This, though, is just one consequence of looking at the world this way. So, for example, instead of understanding our worship as a participation in the heavenly worship joined in the communion of saints and as a form of ritual which is given to us by the Church for us to appropriate to ourselves, they see it as an action of the community, by the community and for the community to change and adapt as we will for our own self-affirmation. Ultimately, the very sense of vocation is undermined: it is not the commitment and very identity to which God calls me to persevere, in good times and in bad, for the sake of my salvation, but a way of life to which I give myself as I deem fit and for as long as it makes me happy.
