St Cyprian's treatise on the Lord's Prayer

Christ has clearly added a law here, binding us to a definite condition, that we should ask for our debts to be forgiven us only as much as we ourselves forgive our debtors, knowing that we cannot obtain what we seek in respect of our own sins unless we ourselves have acted in exactly the same way to those who have sinned against us. This is why he says in another place: *By whatever standard you measure, by that standard will you too be measured.* And the servant who had all his debt forgiven him by his master but would not forgive his fellow-servant was cast into prison: because he would not forgive his fellow-servant, he lost the indulgence that his master had granted him.

And Christ makes this point even more strongly in his teaching: *When you stand up to pray, he says, if you have anything against anyone, forgive it, so that your Father who is in heaven may forgive your sins. But if you do not forgive, nor will your Father in heaven forgive you.* On the day of judgment there are no possible excuses: you will be judged according to your own sentence, and

whatever you have inflicted, that is what you will suffer.

For God commands us to be peacemakers, and to agree, and *to be of one mind in his house*. What he has made us by the second birth he wishes us to continue during our infancy, that we who have begun to be children of God may abide in his peace, and that having one spirit we should also have one heart and one mind. Thus God does not accept the sacrifice of one who is in disagreement but commands him to go back from the altar and first be reconciled with his brother, so that God may be placated by the prayers of a peacemaker. Our peace and concord are the greatest possible sacrifice to God – a people united in the unity of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

Not even when Abel and Cain were making the first sacrifice – not even then did God pay attention to their gifts. He looked into their hearts, and the gift that was acceptable was the one offered by the one who was acceptable in his heart. Abel, peaceable and righteous in sacrificing in innocence to God, taught the rest of us that when we bring our gift to the altar we should come, like him, with the fear of God, with a heart free of deceit, with the law of righteousness, with the peace of concord. He sacrificed in such a way, and so he was worthy to become, afterwards, himself a sacrifice to God: he who bore witness through the first martyrdom, who initiated the Lord's passion by the glory of his blood, had both the Lord's righteousness and the Lord's peace. Such are those who are crowned by the Lord at the end; such are those who will sit and judge with him on the day of judgment.

But he who quarrels and stirs up discord, he who is not at peace with his brethren – the Apostle and holy Scripture together testify that even if he meets death for the sake of Christ's name, he will still be held guilty of fraternal dissension, for it is written, *whoever hates his brother is a murderer*, and the murderer cannot attain the kingdom of heaven or abide with God. No-one can be with Christ who preferred to imitate Judas rather than Christ.

If you are a returning family and have not turned in required documents – i.e., birth and/or baptismal certificates – you will not be able to enroll your child unless these forms are brought in at the time of registration. If the children are new to the St. Edward Faith Formation Program, please bring their Birth and Baptismal certificates. If you do not have these documents, you will not be able to complete the registration process.

CONFIRMATION PROGRAM

Confirmation 1 Registration

Are you 15 years old or in the ninth grade and interested in joining the two-year Confirmation program? If so, the Saint Edward Faith Formation Office will hold interviews from Monday, August 12, through Thursday, August 29. Prospective first-year candidates must be accompanied by a parent to the interview. The last day for interviews is Thursday, August 29, 2013.

Please note: First-year Confirmation interviews are by appointment only and there will be no late acceptances of candidates. Please call the Faith Formation office at 510-797-5588 to schedule your appointment. (If you successfully completed the assessment at the end of the 2012-2013 school year, you do not need to make an appointment to register.)

In addition, there is a mandatory gathering, Rite of Covenant, on Tuesday, September 17th, at 7:00pm, for all first-year candidates who have successfully completed the Confirmation interview process. This will formally mark the candidates' entry into the Confirmation program. A parent must accompany their candidate to this event.

Confirmation 2 Registration

We are accepting registrations for all eligible second-year Confirmation candidates for the 2013-2014 school-year. You must register by no later than Thursday, August 29, 2013. Late registrations will not be accepted. If you are still missing required forms – i.e., Baptismal and Communion certificates, Sponsor forms – you will not be allowed to register. Please bring any missing documents at the time of registration. On Tuesday, September 10th, at 7:00pm, second-year candidates and their parents must attend Conf. 2 Evening of Recollection, which marks the beginning of the second year of Confirmation preparation.

Comentário: Jesus continua seu caminho para Jerusalém, rumo à sua paixão, morte e ressurreição. Seu caminho é o dos cristãos. Pois bem, no caminho, fazem-lhe uma pergunta: “Senhor, é verdade que são poucos os que se salvam?” É daquelas perguntas que Jesus não responde, porque se fundam na curiosidade inútil e não naquilo que ele veio revelar e inaugurar: o Reino de Deus, que exige de nós uma abertura de coração e uma resposta de amor para segui-lo no caminho.

Hoje, é tão comum apresentarem um cristianismo de curiosidade sobre o fim dos tempos, sobre milagres, sobre curas... um cristianismo interesseiro, que busca somente emoção e solução de problemas... Tudo isso é um falso cristianismo: vazio, anti-evangélico (mesmo quando se diz “evangélico”) e sem sentido algum... Um cristianismo que trai o Cristo!

Ao invés de responder a pergunta que lhe fizeram, o Senhor vai direto ao ponto que realmente interessa... Por isso, responde com uma advertência: Não é da nossa conta se são muitos ou poucos os que se salvam. Interessa, isso sim, que tenhamos uma tal atitude hoje, no presente de nossa vida, em relação ao seu Evangelho, que possamos herdar a salvação: “Fazei todo esforço possível para entrar pela porta estreita. Porque eu vos digo que muitos tentarão entrar e não conseguirão”. Portanto, o Senhor chama nossa atenção para o presente, como estamos nos posicionando agora em relação a ele.

Mas, por que afirmar que a porta é estreita e que muitos tentarão e não conseguirão? Será que Deus nos preparou uma armadilha? De modo algum! A porta é estreita porque nos tornamos grandes demais, auto-suficientes demais, prepotentes demais, demasiadamente cheios de nós mesmos! A porta é estreita porque nossas manhas são largas... Portanto, há um combate a ser travado em nós, para nos adequarmos ao Reino de Deus. Seguindo nossa lógica,

nossos instintos, nossas paixões, não entraremos! Não entrará no Reino quem primeiro não deixar o Reino entrar em si, no seu coração e na sua vida!

E há ainda mais dois aspectos importantes para os quais o Senhor chama a nossa atenção: (1) haverá um momento final, definitivo, decisivo e irremediável: “Uma vez que o dono da casa se levantar e fechar a porta, vós, do lado de fora, começareis a bater, dizendo: ‘Senhor, abre-nos a porta!’ Ele responderá: ‘Não sei de onde sois.’” Cuidemos, portanto, porque haverá um momento final, um julgamento definitivo, um céu ou um inferno que nunca passarão! Não nos esqueçamos disso; não brinquemos com isso! Há ainda um segundo aspecto: (2) Seremos julgados por nossa relação com ele, o Cristo Senhor. Se hoje o amamos, se hoje vivemos o seu Evangelho, se hoje praticamos a justiça do Reino que ele trouxe, seremos reconhecidos por ele; caso contrário, seremos rejeitados: “Começareis a bater, dizendo: ‘Senhor, abre-nos a porta!’ ele responderá: ‘Não sei de onde sois. Afastai-vos de mim todos vós que praticais a injustiça’”. Nosso futuro está ligado à nossa atitude concreta em relação a Jesus hoje! Por isso mesmo, hoje escutemos a advertência do Autor da Carta aos Hebreus: “Meu filho, não desprezes a educação do Senhor; pois o Senhor corrige a quem ama e castiga a quem aceita como filho. Portanto, firmas as mãos cansadas e os joelhos enfraquecidos, acertai os passos dos vossos pés”. É no hoje da vida que o Senhor nos espera; é no nosso presente que o nosso futuro eterno é decidido. Why Marriage Matters Most

Supreme Court Justice Anthony Kennedy can't seem to understand why every political community on earth until the year 2000 recognized marriage as the union of a man and a woman. In his mind, this can be explained only by anti-gay "animus."

Justice Kennedy is wrong.

The state isn't in the marriage business because it cares about love or romance, but because the sexual union of a man and a woman can produce new life and this new life deserves a mother and a father. When a newborn isn't raised by the man and the woman -- the mother and the father -- who gave him or her life, social costs run high.

Let's look at what marriage is and why it matters. Let's also consider how redefining marriage will undercut the public purpose and social function of marriage.

Marriage exists to bring a man and a woman together as husband and wife to be father and mother to any children their union produces. Marriage is based on the anthropological truth that men and women are different and complementary, the biological fact that reproduction depends on a man and a woman, and the social reality that children need both a mother and a father.

There is no such thing as "parenting." There is mothering and there is fathering. Although men and women are each capable of providing their children with a good upbringing, typically there are differences in how mothers and fathers interact with their children and the functional roles that they play.

Dads play particularly important roles in the formation of both sons and daughters.

"The burden of social science evidence supports the idea that gender-differentiated parenting is important for human development and that the contribution of fathers to childrearing is unique and irreplaceable," Rutgers University sociologist David Popenoe explains.

"We should disavow the notion that 'mommies can make good daddies,' just as we should disavow the popular notion ... that 'daddies can make good mommies,'" Popenoe concludes. "The two sexes are different to the core, and each is necessary -- culturally and bio-

logically -- for the optimal development of a human being."

Government recognizes marriage because it is an institution that benefits society in a way no other relationship does. Marriage is society's least restrictive means of ensuring the well-being of children. State recognition protects children by encouraging men and women to commit to each other and take responsibility for their children.

Social science confirms this. The best available research evidence shows that children fare best on virtually every examined indicator when reared by their wedded biological parents. Studies that control for other factors, including poverty and genetics, suggest that children reared in intact homes do best on educational achievement, emotional health, familial and sexual development, and delinquency and incarceration.

"It is not simply the presence of two parents ... but the presence of two biological parents that seems to support children's development," a study published by the left-leaning research institution Child Trends concluded:

"Research clearly demonstrates that family structure matters for children, and the family structure that helps children the most is a family headed by two biological parents in a low-conflict marriage. Children in single-parent families, children born to unmarried mothers, and children in stepfamilies or cohabiting relationships face higher risks of poor outcomes."

A study in the *Journal of Marriage and Family* concluded that "the advantage of marriage appears to exist primarily when the child is the biological offspring of both parents."

Promoting marriage as the union of a man and a woman doesn't ban any type of relationship: Adults are free to make choices, and they don't need government sanction or license to do so. All Americans have the freedom to live as they choose, but no one should redefine marriage for everyone else.

While respecting everyone's liberty, government rightly recognizes, protects and promotes marriage as the ideal institution for childbearing and childrearing.
