Sharing in the body and blood of the Lord sanctifies us

St Fulgentius of Ruspe's Tract against Fabian

When we offer the sacrifice the words of our Saviour are fulfilled just as the blessed Apostle Paul reported them: *On the same night he was betrayed the Lord Jesus took some bread, and thanked God for it and broke it, and said: 'This is my body, which is for you: do this as a memorial of me.'* In the same way he took the cup after supper, and said, *'This cup is the new covenant in my blood. Whenever you drink it, do this as a memorial of me.'* Until the Lord comes, therefore, every time you eat this bread and drink this cup, you are proclaiming his death.

So the sacrifice is offered to proclaim the death of the Lord and to be a commemoration of him who laid down his life for us. He himself has said: *A man can have no greater love than to lay down his life for his friends.* So, since Christ died for us, out of love, it follows that when we offer the sacrifice in commemoration of his death, we are asking for love to be given us by the coming of the Holy Spirit. We beg and we pray that just as through love Christ digned to be crucified for us, so we may receive the grace of the Holy Spirit; and that by that grace the

world should be a dead thing in our eyes and we should be dead to the world, crucified and dead. We pray that we should imitate the death of our Lord. Christ, *when he died, died, once for all, to sin, so his life now is life with God.* We pray, therefore, that in imitating the death of our Lord we should *walk in newness of life*, dead to sin and living for God.

The love of God is poured into our hearts by the Holy Spirit, who has been sent to us. When we share in the Lord's body and blood, when we eat his bread and drink his cup, this truly means that we die to the world and have our hidden life with Christ in God, crucifying our flesh and its weaknesses and its desires.

Thus it is that all the faithful who love God and their neighbour drink the cup of the Lord's love even if they do not drink the cup of bodily suffering. Soaked through with that drink, they mortify the flesh in which they walk this earth. Putting on the Lord Jesus Christ like a cloak, their desires are no longer those of the body. They do not contemplate what can be seen but what is invisible to the eyes. This is how the cup of the Lord is drunk when divine love is present; but without that love, you may even give your body to be burned and still it will do you no good. What the gift of love gives us is the chance to become in truth what we celebrate as a mystery in the sacrifice.

BOLETIM PORTUGUÊS MISSA DOMINGO XXX DO TEMPO COMUM



Comentário: No domingo passado, Jesus nos falava da necessidade de rezar sempre sem desanimar. Hoje, nos revela o segredo de uma oração verdadeira e também eficaz. Ele nos conta uma parábola sobre a oração de dois homens que pertencem a duas categorias completamente opostas. Na verdade, o Evangelho quer provocar em nós a pergunta: com qual dos dois me identifico? Com o fariseu ou com o publicano? Prestemos bem atenção a como cada um dos homens reza e assim iremos descobrir. Podemos nos encontrar no lugar do publicano (pecador), que foi justificado; mas também com muita probabilidade, podemos nos encontrar no lugar do fariseu, que por sinal, não foi justificado; este último é aquele que regularmente vai ao templo, ou seja, pode ser que sejamos nós, que regularmente vamos à igreja. Enfim, a parábola em questão é direcionada para todos aqueles que julgam ser bons e desprezam os outros, diz o evangelista Lucas. O fariseu é aquele que se acha justo, certinho, pelo fato de conseguir frequentemente cumprir os preceitos da lei: “eu jejuo duas vezes por semana e dou o dízimo de toda a minha renda”. A atitude dele é aquela de uma pessoa egoísta, cheia de si mesmo. Usa sempre o pronome “eu”. E o que agrava a sua presunção é o fato de desprezar os outros. Não se pode rezar e, ao mesmo tempo, desprezar; dialogar com Deus e ser duros com as pessoas; no fundo, nos deleitamos com os defeitos dos outros para agradar a nossa presunção (Nossa! Comparando-me com fulano de tal, como eu sou bom e correto!). Uma vida assim é cheia de suspeitas e de medos, uma vida triste num mundo corrompido. A oração do fariseu, no final das contas, é um julgamento. De fato, esta parábola é muito inquietante! Mostra como na oração podemos nos separar de Deus e dos outros quando falsificamos a nossa consciência, enganando-nos

quanto a Deus e ao nosso próximo.

Quando estamos falando coisas negativas sobre os outros como aquele fariseu (“não sou como os ladrões, desonestos, adúlteros, nem como este cobrador de impostos”); na verdade, estamos envenenando as nossas vidas. Deus está interessado no nosso interior e não naquilo que aparentamos ser. Precisamos nos conscientizar que não é impressionando uns aos outros que interessa a Deus, mas é nossa vida interior que interessa a ele.

O orgulho é uma cegueira que nos impede de ver nossos próprios erros. É difícil ser humilde. Se nos consideramos humildes, isso já pode ser uma presunção. Ser humilde significa nunca pensar que somos melhores que as outras pessoas, mas que somos humanos, e por isso, limitados tanto quanto os outros. Esta consciência é o que nos estimula a sempre buscar o amadurecimento espiritual.

Às vezes, a única maneira pela qual aprendemos a tratar bem as pessoas, é quando somos maltratados, para que possamos ver como isso machuca e aprender a não fazer com os outros. A pessoa orgulhosa nunca acha que é orgulhosa, porque o orgulho facilmente se esconde. O orgulho é uma máscara que encobre realmente quem somos. O orgulho é um julgamento: julgamos porque somos orgulhosos; julgar, na realidade, é tentar achar um caminho para nos sentirmos melhores em relação a nós mesmos, apontando os erros dos outros. E Deus é um juiz que não faz discriminação de pessoas (1 leitura). Deus não discrimina ninguém; como isto deve doer ao ouvido orgulhoso do presunçoso!
